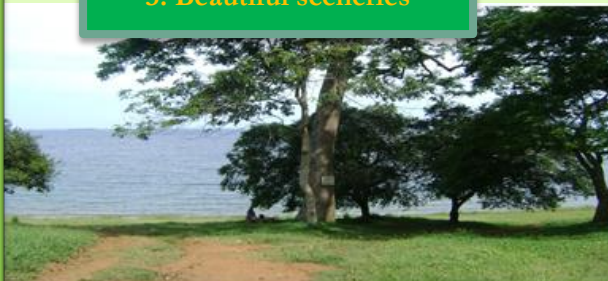




3. Beautiful sceneries

Do you know how many different types of monkeys exist? The gardens will expose you to three types (colobus, vervet, red tailed monkeys)



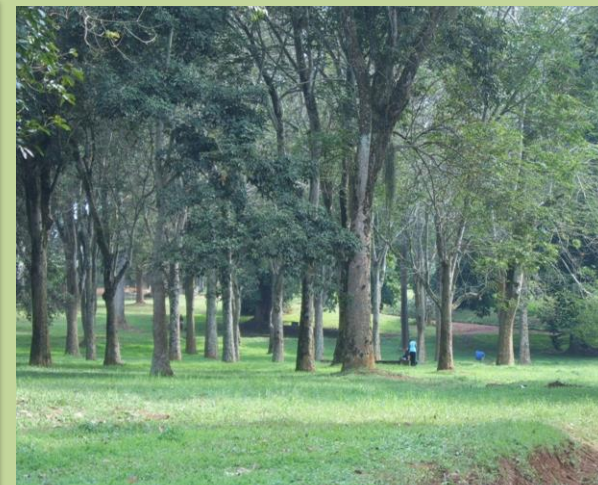

ENTEBBE BOTANIC GARDENS

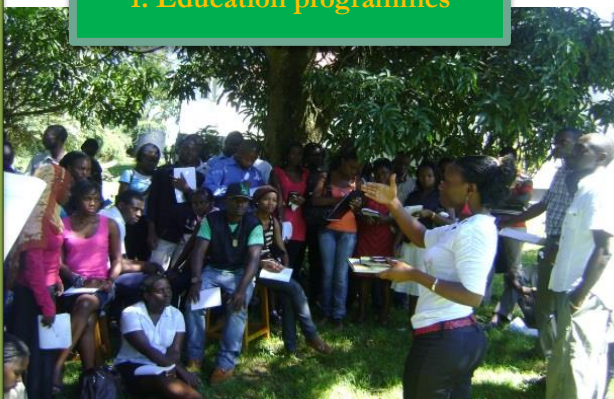
The Entebbe Botanic Gardens (EBG) is conveniently located near Entebbe International Airport within a 5 minutes' drive. It is the first place where plants of potential value for agriculture and industrial use were first introduced, evaluated and planted in Uganda (1898). These crops include Coffee, Rubber, Cotton, Clove, medicinal plants and many others. The Gardens occupy 40 ha of land of gently undulating hills sloping towards Lake Victoria shore line. The glamorous 1.5 km shoreline, several unique scenic views, the tropical natural forest, all house great diversity of plant and animal resources amongst which are; different types of monkeys, birds, butterflies, spiders, reptiles and other valuable species.

Apart from the education tours, research and social activities, the Gardens offer peaceful environment away from the noisy towns. It is the perfect place for relaxing, boat cruising, picnics and family gatherings.

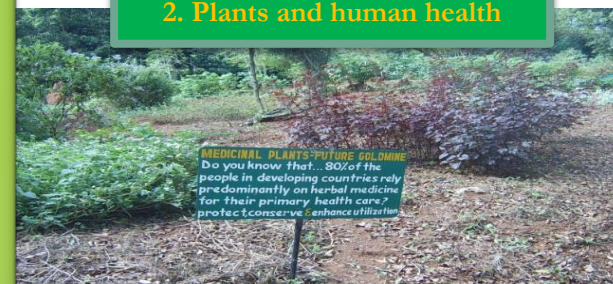
